SHIPPING

PACKAGING FOR SHIPMENT

Place fabric bag into plastic bag and then in a sturdy reusable carton. Use strapping tape to seal. Your entry will be returned in the same

carton. If we are to ship the entry after the show, enclose a pre-addressed return label and check payable to PBCQG for return shipping and insurance. Place this information in an envelope inside the carton.

INSURANCE

Insurance coverage will be provided while items are in the possession of the Guild. Maximum for insurance coverage is \$300 for small quilts and clothing, and \$600 for large quilts, unless a copy of a certified appraisal of higher value is attached to registration form.

CATEGORIES AND RULES

CATEGORIES

LP - Large pieced: Entirely pieced. Width plus length must be greater than 120".

SP - Small pieced: Entirely pieced. Width plus length must not be greater than 120".

LA - Large appliqué: Majority of quilt must be appliqué techniques. Width plus length must be greater than 120".

SA - Small appliqué: Majority of quilt must be appliqué techniques. Width plus length must be less than 120".

MX - Mixed: - Relatively even amount of piecing and appliqué is used to develop the design of the top - all sizes.

M - Miniature: Any technique. Must be a miniaturization of a full quilt design, including binding. Width plus length must be no greater than 40". No single blocks.

D - Duet: A quilt that has two persons involved in its completion. Includes all techniques as well as quilting by a person other than the maker of the top.

G - Group: A quilt that has more than two persons involved in its completion. Involves all techniques as well as quilting if by a person other than the makers of the top.

A - Art: Original design - any techniques, any size. Must be made of fabric, have three layers, and contain quilting. A quilt based on traditional patterns and designs should be entered in another category. No commercial patterns, kits, or copies of previous works.

IN - Innovative Design: Interpretation of a traditional design that demonstrates that the quilter has stretched the boundaries of "traditional." Any techniques, any size.

W - Wearable Art: Fashionable and

wearable garments, having three layers, and a visible portion of which must be quilted.

O - Others: Whole cloth, crazy quilts, embroidery of all kinds (hand and machine) all sizes. No Kit Quilts, Yo Yo, Cathedral Window, Home Dec (Pillows, Table Runners, etc.) and accessories (purses), unless part of a complete ensemble under Wearables.

AN-Antique: Any technique and any size for exhibition only.

AWARDS

Ribbons and cash awards of \$150, \$100 and \$50 for First, Second and Third place in all categories. Each prize will be awarded at the judge's discretion. All prizes in all categories may not be awarded. Ribbons will be awarded for Honorable Mention. The Best of Show will receive \$250.00. Ribbons and gift baskets will also be awarded for Best Use of Color, Best Overall Design, Best Hand Quilting, Best Machine Quilting, Judge's Choice, Judge's Recognition, and Viewers' Choice.

RULES

1. Any individual or group may enter. All persons involved in the construction or quilting must be listed on the entry form.
2. There is a limit of two entries per category per person(s) or group for judged quilts. A separate entry form and photo is required for each entry. Form may be photocopied. **Entry fees: \$10 for judged items, and \$5 for exhibit only.**
3. A non-returnable color photograph of the item must accompany each entry form for purposes of identification and insurance.

4. Entries must remain on display for the duration of the show.
5. Each entry must have a label on a lower back corner with the maker/owner's name and address. Wearables must have a label on each piece in an inconspicuous place. The label should be covered with a removable piece of fabric for judging.
6. No tied quilts or pre-printed blocks will be accepted.
7. Each entry must have a 4" sleeve stitched to the top back of the quilt except miniatures which must have a 1½" sleeve. This sleeve must be attached on both top and bottom edges of the sleeve to accommodate the hanging rod. Bed-sized quilts must have an additional sleeve - the top of which must be attached 86" from the bottom edge of the quilt so that the quilt will not touch the floor.
8. Each entry must be enclosed in a separate fabric bag or pillowcase with the entrant's name clearly written on the bag.
9. Quilts must be clean and in excellent condition. Antique quilts must be appropriate for hanging and are for exhibit only.
10. Quilt size, width and length must be listed on entry form. Accurate measurements are a must.
11. The PBCQG can accept only a limited number of very large quilts.
12. All quilts other than those in the antique category must have been made within the last five years.
